CNR 501 Counseling Resources in Literature III

3 credits

Examine fundamental Biblical truths developed in these books and learn how to share them effectively with others in a counseling setting.



BIB 500 Old Testament Foundations

3 credits

Study important Biblical themes in the Old Testament that are critical to each person's continual spiritual development and growth.



CPI 510 Counseling Presenting Issues - Abuse

2 credits

Examine how to detect, assess, and counsel individuals suffering from common areas of abuse, including sexual and domestic.



BCI 600 Biblical Counseling Internship I

4 credits

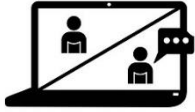
In this course you will counsel and train a student in their 1st semester of their 1st year in the Biblical Counseling Bachelor's program, with supervision from a Faculty Supervisor.



CPI 520 Counseling Presenting Issues – Addictions

2 credits

Address how to detect and counsel individuals suffering from common addictions including eating disorders, substance abuse, pornography, self-harm and video gaming.



CSF 500 Counselor Spiritual Formation

3 credits

Meet with your Faculty Supervisor once a month to discuss personal updates, as well as counseling issues you may have with current clients.



CPI 530 Counseling Presenting Issues – Anxiety and Depression

2 credits

Examine the stressors that cause anxiety and fear in so many people today. Discover Biblical solutions for overcoming these issues and learning to live with peace and joy.



CPI 540 Counseling Presenting Issues – Grief

2 credits

Explore effective methods for dealing with grief that comes from loss through death, divorce, or suicide.



MTP 690 Master's Thesis Paper or Project

4 credits

This thesis paper or project is the culmination of learning experiences for students in the Master's program. Students prepare a written proposal for a research project. Once approved and completed, the paper or project will be presented before a thesis committee for a final grade.

4 credits

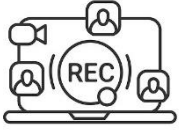

2 credits

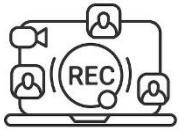
Learn how to detect, assess, and counsel individuals who have suffered trauma in various areas of their lives.

4 credits

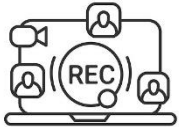
